Aly and Thomas grew up in Kearney. Thomas graduated from Northland Christian in and attended seminary for more than a year. He's currently a truck driver for Zipco Contracting and works part time at Home Depot with hopes of becoming a carpenter. Aly, a gymnast, graduated last year from Kearney where she was an All-American Cheerleader. She attends Maple Woods Community College and works in admitting at North Kansas City Hospital, on her path to becoming a nurse. "I've always wanted to help people, even at young age, and nursing is one of

the best ways to help people," Aly said. "The opportunities to spread the word are endless in a hospital, so I look forward to helping patients physically and spiritually."

Together they like watching movies, shopping and working with kids at church. Aly is an avid reader and enjoys aunt life while Thomas likes to golf and hunt. He also says he has gospel music in his blood, growing up going to concerts with his dad, Jeremy, and getting to perform with some big-name groups. An added bonus of Old Union is getting to see so

many of Thomas' family members at church every Sunday.

Thomas sums up OUC's strength with one word: community.
"Sitting in the [sound] booth when 'Family of God' is playing,
I see every single member stand up and greet friends. It's rare in a church for everyone to have such vibrant friendships. The Bible says we are called to be the hands and feet of Christ, and our members are the hands and feet of Christ. We are a strong community, and a strong community makes a strong church."

That's something she and her husband, Justin, value. "Pastor Steve does a really good job of deep diving into the Bible," Justin said. "So many churches water down the scripture and are afraid of offending people instead of preaching the Word. Today we need really strong pastors and strong leaders, and as Christians we have to stand up to what's wrong."

OUC has certainly evolved, and April and Justin would say their hearts have, too. They both had a strong foundation, growing up in church and being homeschooled, but eventually found themselves going through the motions with their faith. They both have rededicated themselves to the Lord and are committed to putting God first in everything they do.

The couple was acquainted many years ago and reconnected with God's help. They were married nine years ago and later moved to Lawson into the home where April was raised. Justin is from Pleasant Hill and he, too, has been involved in different churches. One standout experience was accompanying 23 youth to Alaska through Youth With a Mission to work in a Native American village and start building a school.

The couple has a blended family of four children and eight grandchildren. April is a certified aromatherapist and used to play the piano and serve on the Fire Department. As they are able, the Grays like to hike and Justin loves to fish. They also look forward to float trips during the annual Missouri Council of the

Blind camp in Steelville. April had debilitating health issues and was disabled before her eyesight declined, but retinitis pigmentosa, a genetic eye disease that causes vision loss over time, has left April legally blind like her mother. Justin suffered a broken back that healed incorrectly, then reinjured it in a tree trimming accident. His disability brings its own challenges, yet he remains grateful for the time he can spend at home with April and says prayer is the most positive thing they can do for one another. April added, "When you suffer pain and problems together, it can cause a rift in a marriage if you don't have Jesus. But when you pray together, you show you really care for the person. Prayer helps us get through our struggles."
